# BOOK WRITING REFLECTION COMPETITION AMONG GRADE 7 AND 8 LEARNERS

- 1. In order to valuably persuade students to pursue extracurricular competitions and opportunities, the founder of project **BuildBloom**, **Ms. Precy Zea**, initiates a writing competition designed to encourage students to read books and reflect on them.
- 2. The writing contest aims to: (a) encourage early high school students to develop an appreciation for reading and writing; and (b) foster writing and critical thinking skills among them.
- 2. The contest is open to Grade 7 and 8 learners within the Division. Each contestant is encouraged to write and submit one entry only composed of 400 to 500-word book report.
- 3. The contestants may opt to submit their entry through the following:
- a. BuildBloom's email address: <u>buildbloom2019@gmail.com</u> with a cover page attached containing the student's name, grade, age, school, selected book, and entry's number of words.
  - b. Google Form: https://forms.gle/rnNQuH5gfK2gyzLt7

- 3. There will be five winners who will be awarded with a **Certificate** and a **cash prize of Php 1,000** each. In addition, the school with the highest proportion of Grade 7 and 8 students joining the contest will receive a **Certificate** and **10 books** to be added to their library or reading room.
- 4. The observed Timeline in the contest is as follows:
  - a. September 30, 2019—Competition opens for submissions
  - b. December 15, 2019—competition closes
  - c. February 15, 2020 informing schools with winning students
- d. March 2020 Official announcement of winners with certificates and prizes

### WHAT IS IT?

### WHO CAN ENTER?


The competition is open to Grade 7 and 8 students attending a public school in <u>Misamis</u> Oriental. Only one submission per student is allowed.


# HOW DOES A STUDENT SUBMIT AN ENTRY?

There are a few options for submission.

- Email: entries can be emailed to buildbloom2019@gmail.com with a cover page attached. This cover page will contain the student's name, grade, age, school, selected book and the entry's number of words.
- Google form: Students can submit their details and their entry through https://forms.gle/rnNQuH5gfK2gyzLt7
   I am aware that many students may not have internet access. In these situations, it would be good if a teacher can take a clear photo of the student's handwritten entry and the required student details, then email these to

buildbloom2019@gmail.com.





#### WHAT'S THE PRIZE?

Five winning students will be awarded with a Certificate of Achievement and a cash prize of Php 1000 each.

The school with the highest proportion of Grade 7 and 8 students entering the competition will receive a Certificate and 10 books to be added to their library or reading room. To be able to calculate this, we will require an accurate number of Grade 7 and 8 students from each school or DepEd CDO Division.

### WHY DO THE COMPETITION?

Reading is extremely important because it builds literacy and creativity. The contest's main objective is to encourage early high school students to develop an appreciation for reading and writing. It aims to foster writing skills and critical thinking and motivate students to pursue extracurricular competitions and opportunities.

BuildBloom has volunteer judges from a range of backgrounds who assess the entries based on a marking criteria. While we cannot release the criteria, the Writing Tips document in the Google Drive is of significant help.

#### PRIZES AND AWARDS

We fully fund the prizes (both the cash prizes and books) and printing of certificates. We will deliver these to the intended schools. We ask that you honestly present the award and cash prize to the winning recipient(s). Alternatively, we may have a representative, pending availability, to present these.

#### **FEEDBACK**

It is our hope to be able to provide each student feedback on their entry. This cannot be confirmed as it will depend on the volume of submissions. However, we know it is important for students to be able to receive feedback on their work so we will endeayour to do this.

#### **PUBLICITY**

By participating, students give us the right to post their entries on BuildBloom's social media accounts and website should they win. We also reserve the right to post up the names and photos of winners on our social media and website, as well as provide these to media outlets. This may include local newspapers, local news sites and radio stations.
