

A. Rhyming Poem Contest

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. There will be at least one (1) grade school participant per school.
- 2. The rhyming poem contest will be held on November 14, 2019 at Cagayan de Oro Senior High School (CDNHS-SHS).
- 3. Participants should pre-register first on or before October 31, 2019.
- 4. The contest proper starts promptly at 2:00 pm and will end at exactly 3:00 PM. Participants' registration starts exactly at 1:00 pm. Each entry will be identified through number codes, which will be given upon registration of every participant.
- 5. Participants will be provided with the necessary writing materials, such as ball pen and paper.
- 6. No one is allowed to go out of the room while the contest is still going on. The use of cellular phones during the contest proper is not admissible.
- 7. Rhyming poems must be in consonance with the theme, "Inclusive.Innovative.Interconnected" and must be written in English language.
- 8. Entries must only have 4-6 stanzas, with no word limit in each line.
- 9. All Rhyming poems that will be submitted by the contestants will become part of the City library collection.

Conduct Code

The participants, school representatives, parents, or spectators are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect, honesty and good sportsmanship during the competition.

Dress Code

 The contestants are required to wear their school uniform. Immodest and inappropriate dress will not be tolerated and will result in the disqualification of the participant from the competition.

Supervision

It is the teacher-coach/ parent's responsibility to provide adequate supervision for their students at all times during the competition.

Awards

- All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- The top three (3) best Rhyming poem contestant will receive the following cash prizes:
 - > First Place P2,000.00 + certificate of recognition
 - ➤ Second Place P 1,500.00 + certificate of recognition
 - Third Place P 1,000.00 + certificate of recognition

B. Battle of the Band Contest

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. The Battle of the Bands is open to eight (8) groups' only ages 18-40 years old. This contest is on a first come, first serve basis.
- 2. Registration is up to OCTOBER 31, 2019 only. The order of presentation will be determined through the band's registration numbers.
- 3. Each band must bring their own instruments and equipment except for the drum set which will be provided for by the event organizers.
- 4. Each band is given two (2) songs to perform. The first song will be of own choice and the second should be a song related to the National Book Week theme, "Inclusive. Innovative. Interconnected." (personal or own composition of the song).
- 5. Each band will be given 15 minutes to prepare their instruments and equipment and to perform. A deduction of two (2) points will be done for every excess of one (1) minute.
- 6. There will be a representative from the organizer to serve as a time keeper to remind the contestants of their time. She/he will raise banners to signify that TIME has already started (GREEN), there is only sixty (60) seconds remaining time (YELLOW), Time is up (RED).
- 7. The performance of the bands will be judged according to the:

Planning/Preparedness – 20% Originality – 30% Interface with audience – 10% Quality of performance – 20% Presentation – 20%

Total - 100%

8. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.

Conduct Code

 The participants are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect, honesty and good sportsmanship during the competition.

Awards

- All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- The top three (3) contestant will receive the following cash prizes:
 - > First Place P5,000.00 + plaque of recognition
 - ➤ Second Place P 3,000.00 + plague of recognition
 - ➤ Third Place P 2,500.00 + plaque of recognition

C. The Best League of Disney Character Cosplay Contest

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. All contestants must pre-register first on or before October 31, 2019.
- 2. The Cosplay Competition is open to high school students (Grade 7 to grade 12). There will be at least one (1) contestant per school.
- 3. Upon registration, all contestants must provide all the necessary information outlined in the registration sheet.
- 4. Contestants must be present at the designated stand-by-area at least 30 minutes before the competition will start. Please ensure that only finishing touches need to be done by assembly time to ensure the smooth running of the competition. The cosplay judges will already be observing you during this time.
- 5. Each contestant's presentation and costume will be assessed by three judges as per the criteria stated below.
- 6. Contestants MUST provide a hard copy of the character they shall be cosplaying upon registration.
- 7. During the event, all contestants MUST register at least 1 hour before the start of the competition to be considered eligible for participation.
- 8. Contestants in each category shall have corresponding time limits for their onstage performance. Exceeding the time provided by less than two minutes will result in a minimal deduction from the overall score of the contestant. Exceeding the time provided by more than two minute will result in a maximum deduction from the overall score of the contestant or even disqualification.
- 9. All props must be presented to staff at the Cosplay Competition Registration Desk upon registering for the contest. Failure to present your weapons-even seemingly harmless ones-may result in your may even be escorted from the premises.
- 10. Dangerous props such as metallic weaponry (swords, knives, etc.), firearms and pyrotechnics of ANY kind that may cause damage to the venue or harm to fellow cosplayers and/ or even staff and attendees are strictly NOT allowed as props for the Cosplay Competition. Any material such as cardboard, PVC, Styrofoam, props for the competition.
- 11. The organizers reserve the right to adjust the rules of this competition in any way it sees fit and disqualify any entry for non-compliance with the rules and regulations outlined in this document.
- 12. Permission is granted to the Organizers to use the costumes photographed/filmed during the contest for future promotions.
- 13. The organizers reserve the right to refuse entry/display of any costume entered into the competition that they deem inappropriate. The organizers also reserve the right to disqualify any contestants within reason. All of the Organizer's decisions are final.
- 14. By entering the competition, the participant agrees to abide by all the terms and conditions are set out in this document. Participants who do not follow these rules will be disqualified.

Conduct Code

Supervision

D. Author's Look - Alike Contest

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. For grade school category, One (1) contestant per school coming either from any grade levels in grade 4 to grade 6 pupils.
- 2. Exposure:
 - a. Portrayal of chosen and famous author (included in the introduction: name of the author portrayed and author quote maximum of 30 seconds, English/Filipino).
 - b. Selection of Top five
 - c. Question and answer portion (all about authors and their write-ups).
- 3. Props men and back-ups are not allowed.
- 4. Uses only improvise props (harm free).
- 5. A deduction of 1 point if the intro exceed more than 30 seconds.
- Avoid hash tag, punch line, dramatization and hugot lines.
 Note: Do not include the name of the contestant and the school during introduction.

Conduct Code

The participants, school representatives, parents, or spectators are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect, honesty and good sportsmanship during the competition.

Supervision

It is the teacher-coach/ parent's responsibility to provide adequate supervision for their students at all times during the competition.

Awards

- All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- The top three (3) contestant will receive the following cash prizes:
 - ➤ First Place P2,000.00 + certificate of recognition
 - Second Place P 1,500.00 + certificate of recognition
 - ➤ Third Place P 1,000.00 + certificate of recognition

E. Book Face! Photo Contest

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. For secondary category, One (1) contestant coming either from any grade levels in grade 7 to grade 12.
- 2. Replace your face with a book cover, and then snap a picture.
- 3. Submit your Book face picture in the library on or before November 7, 2019.
- 4. The organizer will post the picture in the COCPL FACEBOOK account.
- 5. Vote by liking your favorite entry on COCPL FACEBOOK page until Nov. 15, 2019 morning.

F. Get Caught Reading

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. This is a school activity encourages students to read during their free time.
- 2. Students can be anywhere in the campus and be in the midst of reading to recive their prize.
- 3. The Librarian will take picture of the student to add to a collection of students who were caught.
- 4. The most numbered pictures caught in reading will be given prizes.

Awards.

- The top three (3) contestant will receive the following cash prizes:
 - > First Place P1,000.00 + certificate of recognition
 - Second Place P 800.00 + certificate of recognition
 - > Third Place P 500.00 + certificate of recognition

G. Spelling Bee Contest

Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. The spelling competition is open to grade 1 to grade 3 pupils. Each school endorsed one (1) student qualifier.
- 2. Deadline of the submission of the names of participants for pre-registration is on or before Oct. 31, 2019. Late registration will not be accepted on the actual day of the competition.
- 3. All contestants have to be in the designated venue on or before 1:00 PM. Attendance checking of the participants will start at 1:00 PM.

Conduct Code

 The participants, school representatives, parents, or spectators are expected to display politeness, courteousness, patience, respect, honesty and good sportsmanship during the competition.

Dress Code

The contestants are required to wear their school uniform. Immodest and inappropriate dress will not be tolerated and will result in the disqualification of the participant from the competition.

Supervision

It is the teacher-coach/ parent's responsibility to provide adequate supervision for their students at all times during the competition.

Awards

- All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- The top three (3) best spellers will receive the following cash prizes:
 - First Place P3,000.00 + certificate of recognition
 - ➤ Second Place P 2,000.00 + certificate of recognition
 - > Third Place P 1,000.00 + certificate of recognition

Official Dictionary

All words in Spelling Bee word list will be taken from Merriam Webster
 Elementary Dictionary, the official dictionary of the Spelling Bee competition.

Spelling Bee Procedures

There are two (2) phases/stages of the Spelling Contest, the Easy or Elimination round, the Difficult Phase or Final Phase.

I. Easy Phase/Elimination Round

- 1. Participants will be provided with permanent markers and writing sheets during the competition. The monitoring committee will collect the writing sheets after the judges check the spelling of every contestant.
- 2. There will be ten (10) words to be given for this elimination round by the Bee Master/ Pronouncer. This is to give all the contestants fair chance and

opportunity to spell the same words and a way of determining who will be able to continue to the next round.

- 3. The Bee Master/ Pronouncer will pronounce each word twice and give an aid to word identification. Countdown will start after the word has been pronounced the second time by the Bee Master/ Pronouncer.
- 4. Contestants will be given a maximum of 15 seconds to simultaneously write the word on the writing sheet provided.
- 5. Should a participant wish to change the spelling that he/she has written down, the first one should be crossed out with one horizontal line and the new & final spelling, be written clearly above the crossed out word. A participant is allowed to change his/her answer within the time allotted for a particular word.
- 6. Contestants are required to raise their writing sheet after 15 seconds is over and to put it down only after the Judges have checked their spelling.
- 7. Those who spelled five (5) or six (6) words correctly will continue in the Bee, while those who correctly spelled only four (4) words & below will be eliminated from the bee.

II. Difficult Phase

- 1. There will be fifteen (15) words to be given for this difficult phase by the Bee Master/ Pronouncer. This stage the participants will spell the word and give the meaning of the spelled word (with the given choices A and B given by the Bee Master). The participants will spell the correct word and write the correct letter of the given choices. Correct spelling but incorrect meaning or vice versa is not considered.
- 2. The Bee Master/ Pronouncer will pronounce each word twice and give the choices of the meaning of the spelled word. Countdown will start after the word has been pronounced the second time by the Bee Master/ Pronouncer.
- 4. Contestants will be given a maximum of 15 seconds to simultaneously write the word on the writing sheet provided.
- 5. Should a participant wish to change the spelling that he/she has written down, the first one should be crossed out with one horizontal line and the new & final spelling, be written clearly above the crossed out word. A participant is allowed to change his/her answer within the time allotted for a particular word.
- 6. Contestants are required to raise their writing sheet after 15 seconds is over and to put it down only after the Judges have checked their spelling.
- 7. The top three (3) that got the highest number of correct spelled word will be chosen as winners. (1st, 2nd, 3rd winner)
