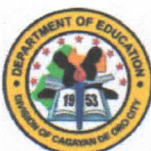

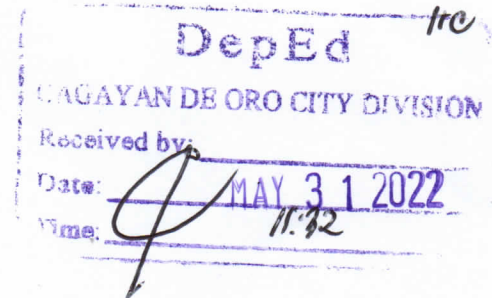

"INFLUENCE THE FUTURE"

A 1-Day Training for Public High School Teachers of Cagayan de Oro City on Climate Change and Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)

June 22, 2022 | 08:00 - 05:00 PM

BACKGROUND

More than half of the world's population live in cities while around 70% of the world's global carbon emission comes from cities with transport, energy, and waste management comprising its majority. As urbanization progress year after year, the number of urban dwellers is also expected to double by 2050. Acting as centers of both political and corporate power, cities are seen as important actors towards a sustainable climate transition.

Having the key to transform consumption and production patterns in order to fit within the capacity of our planet, cities also play an integral part in preventing the global temperature to exceed 1.5C and reaching the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG). Cities' local governments and its citizens have the power to reduce urban greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, avoid further carbon lock-in and decrease the cost of future carbon reduction.

Particularly, young people are seen to be the critical players on the implementation of these sustainable development targets and limiting to 1.5C goal. Rather than mere beneficiaries, today's youth have the most at stake in how society responds to climate change and achievement of sustainable development goals. The youth of today can deliver the change that we want to have in the future. Their active engagement is fundamental to achieving an ecological, inclusive and stable societies by the target date, and to averting the worst threats and challenges to sustainable development including the impacts of climate change.

Reinforcing the development and implementation of transformative solutions for a One Planet Future, it is important to value the fact that every one of us is part of the solution in securing a progressive and sustainable urban development. WWF is committed in supporting the creation and development of One Planet Cities around the globe – *cities that enable all people to thrive and prosper while respecting the ecological limits of our one and only planet*. The *One Planet Cities (OPC)* project aims to assist cities to increase political leadership and public engagement by having them understand their emissions, implement progressive policies and engage cities' young people for an inclusive planning process towards achieving the sustainable development targets and limiting to the 1.5C goal.

In the Philippines, WWF is partnering with various cities in implementing the OPC project. One of these cities is Cagayan de Oro City, who has been a long-time local government partner since 2015. This highly-urbanized city serves as the gateway to Northern Mindanao and is also one of the fastest-growing cities in the Philippines due to its rich agricultural and forest lands, scenic tourist spots, bodies of water, good infrastructure and utilities, and concentration of health and research centers.

Recognizing the critical role of education in shaping the future, WWF-Philippines will conduct a one-day face to face activity with the public high school teachers of Cagayan de Oro City entitled "*Influence the Future*" on June 22, 2022, 8:00AM to 5:00PM.





OBJECTIVES

In coordination with the City's School Division Office (SDO), this activity aims to gather "YES-O Advisers" of all the 40 public high schools of Cagayan de Oro City for a one-day training on climate change and education for sustainable development. Specifically, this activity intends to:

- *Present briefly the importance of working with cities including an overview of WWF's "One Planet Cities (OPC)" project*
- *Provide a platform for public high school teachers to have updated information on climate change and sustainable development*
- *Highlight the role of education on sustainability and introduce the concept of Education for Sustainable Development or ESD*
- *Showcase learning examples of ESD integration in classroom*
