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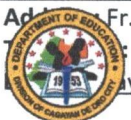

**IMPLEMENTATION OF HOMEROOM GUIDANCE FOR SY 2022- 2023**

To: Chiefs, CID and SGOD

1. Relative to the full implementation of Homeroom Guidance in SY 2022- 2023, the field is directed to follow the provisions stipulated in DM-OUCI-2021-346.
2. The following principles and policies are hereby reiterated:
  - a. Homeroom Guidance shall be **reflected in the class program** of every school and other school documents such as SF-9 and SF-10 as Homeroom Guidance.
  - b. Homeroom Guidance shall not be viewed as a formal learning area like Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao (EsP) and the like. Hence, class programs integrating Homeroom Guidance in other learning areas are not acceptable.
  - c. Teaching Homeroom Guidance shall be equivalent to one (1) teaching load on top of the teachers' advisory and subject's load.
  - d. Homeroom Guidance shall be scheduled once a week with a time allotment of 60 minutes.
  - e. It shall be included in the Kindergarten blocks of time. For Grades 1 to 12 it shall be taught separately from other learning areas.
  - f. The Homeroom Guidance Self-Learning Modules shall be used. Schools may opt to translate the learning material in their mother tongue or any



language convenient to the learners to ensure participation and interaction during the session and better understanding of the concepts.

3. With the issuance of this Memorandum, this Office expects a coordinated implementation of Homeroom Guidance as a responsive program that equips learners with competencies to address issues not included in the formal learning areas but is very essential to their development.
